Improperly constructed and maintained gravel roads are substantial producers of eroded soil that ends up in Maine's lakes, rivers, streams and coastal waters. In addition to damaging habitat, this eroded soil also carries in pollutants that affect water quality. This half-day workshop is not designed to correct all road problems but to provide solutions to problems that will significantly reduce the amount of eroded soil that is produced. You will learn non-traditional techniques developed through experience that will lower your road's impacts until full repair can be properly implemented.
